

Nationally Recognized Health Care Leader To Keynote 8th Annual Research Symposium



Among the certainties in health care is the constant pace and intensity of *change*. Lurking in the background are unrecognized "disruptors" that can impact future health care delivery.

The [AMCP Foundation's 8th Annual Research Symposium](#), to be held on Oct. 22 prior to AMCP Nexus 2018 in Orlando, Fla., will identify the biggest changes and potential disruptors facing health care today. The Symposium will present new findings from the [Foundation's ongoing research initiative](#), benchmarking the health services landscape around managed care pharmacy. Speakers and attendees will focus on emerging trends related to drug pricing and spending; innovative and curative therapies; health coverage; big data and health IT; industry consolidation; and health care public policy.

Presenters are expected to identify programs to address the anticipated changes, as well as describe the status of implementation and consequences of inaction by stakeholders, including policy makers, employers, patient and consumer groups, physician groups, hospital systems, IDNs and ACOs, health plans and PBMs.

Setting the stage as keynote speaker to help attendees cut through the maze of issues is **Dr. Reed V. Tuckson**. Dr. Tuckson has been [appointed to leadership roles](#) at the National Institutes of Health, the National Academy of Medicine, as well as numerous Federal Advisory Committees and Academic Boards.

Dr. Reed is Managing Director of Tuckson Health Connections, which focuses on initiatives that support optimal health and wellbeing through the intersection of individual and community health promotion and disease prevention; applied data and analytics; and the application of telehealth and biotech innovations. Previously, he enjoyed a long tenure as Executive Vice President and Chief of Medical Affairs for UnitedHealth Group. Dr. Reed has been recognized several times by *Modern Healthcare Magazine* as one of the "50 Most Powerful Physician Executives" in health care.
