INTERNSHIP DETAILS

- Each intern will be assigned to a health plan, pharmacy benefit management company, specialty pharmacy, or other site over a ten-week period.
- Interns will also spend 1-2 days at a Pfizer U.S. location.
- The program will provide interns a salary designed to cover most living expenses.

INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Currently enrolled as a full-time Doctor of Pharmacy degree student in an ACPE-accredited school or college of pharmacy with anticipated graduation in 2022 or 2023.
- Candidates must submit an online application, two letters of recommendation and a letter of good academic standing from their institution including cumulative GPA.
- Must be eligible for employment in the U.S.

Oncology Organized Customer Field Medical Team**, to fostering health care leadership through student pharmacist education and to improving the quality of patient care in the managed care pharmacy setting. 2021 INTERNSHIP OVERVIEW

The goal of the Program is to develop future leaders in managed health care through exposure to population health and managed care pharmacy principles via concepts such as formulary management, benefit design, medication therapy management and adherence management **with a focus on oncology**. Working directly with pharmacists and other members of the health care team in oncology, specialty pharmacy, or related business units, interns will gain an appreciation of how managed care pharmacy principles are used to maximize health care resources and patient care outcomes. Two student pharmacists will be selected for internships through a nationwide selection process.

Interns are exposed to the pharmaceutical industry with Pfizer Field Medical Directors, to a professional membership society with AMCP, and to a public charity with AMCP Foundation. As a part of the structured ten-week internship program, student pharmacists will be matched with virtual preceptors and present capstone research projects at AMCP Nexus 2021. This exposure will ensure that interns experience a well-rounded program.
